



New Hope Church Camp Rules & Policies for Students

1. All campers shall be responsible for all rules while attending camp. Failure to adhere to camp rules will result in a review by the camp staff and possible dismissal. If dismissal occurs, the parent/guardian will pick the camper up.
2. Every student/adult on the premises must be registered as a camper or worker.
3. All campers, counselors, workers, and staff should be treated with respect. **No bullying, profanity, or harassing of any type is allowed.**
4. All campers shall bring their own lunch, Bible, and personal items and shall be responsible for the same during camp. (Please let us know if you need a Bible, and we can provide one.)
5. All campers must be present and on time for all gatherings, activities, meals, and services.
6. All campers will be assigned to a crew leader. Please feel free to go to your crew leaders for any help you may need. Arrangements will be made for the immediate dismissal of anyone showing disrespect to camp staff and leaders.
7. No camper or worker will be allowed off the campus at any time without proper authority. Stay within the boundaries of the camp. Do not go beyond the cleared area.
8. Water day will take place in supervised groups. Boys will be allowed to wear boxer-type swimming trunks, and girls will be allowed to wear a modest one-piece bathing suit. OR, a dark t-shirt must be worn over two-piece swimsuits for girls. Proper attire will be worn to and from the river/lake. (Shirt and shorts) We will not be walking in only bathing suits. Shoes will be worn at all times on campus; flip-flops are recommended for the showers/river areas.
9. Dress Code: Campers and workers will be expected to dress in modest clothing. Shorts must be fingertip length. No clothing that is revealing (bare midriffs, exposed cleavage, miniskirts) or has vulgar or suggestive slogans is allowed. This is to edify Christ during our daytime activities and services and to honor ourselves and fellow campers.
10. No cell phones, unnecessary electronics, or secular/adult-content material are allowed.
11. There will be absolutely no vandalizing or destruction of other people's property. This will result in immediate dismissal.
12. For campers' safety, there will be no practical jokes at other campers' expense. No "horseplay" or "roughhousing" will be allowed. Hands will be kept to ourselves. Counselors will strictly enforce this rule.
13. For campers' safety, there will be no smoking, alcohol, drugs, weapons, firearms, fireworks, or other harmful devices allowed. It is also recommended to not bring valuable items.
14. There will be no public display of affection (no kissing or cuddling, whether same gender or opposite gender).
15. All campers will participate in all planned activities and services.
